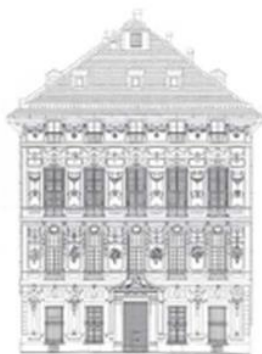

di Strada Nuova



In Genoa, the Sixteenth century Palazzo Nicolosio Lomellino rises along via Garibaldi, the historical road formerly known as Strada Nuova, where stand the most important Palazzi of the Genoese nobility (the so-called Rolli, listed by UNESCO as world heritage sites). Built for Nicolosio Lomellino between 1563 and 1569, it was designed by Giovan Battista Castello, architect and painter from Lombardy. The Palazzo was later bought by Luigi Centurione, in 1711 by the Pallavicino family, and then shortly owned by the Raggios. Baron Andrea Podestà, a prominent Genoese personality, and three times elected mayor of the City, bought it in 1865. The current owners inherited the Palazzo from him.
